This change was made to help lessen confusion in the field with the implementation of the NH Regional Early Childhood System where there are now seven named "Regional Leads" serving as backbone organizations. 

Early Childhood Convening and Family Leadership Strategy Map

On March 31, the Early Childhood Regional Leads and the Alliance hosted an Early Childhood Convening - Putting the Pieces Together. It was the first opportunity for the Regions and Coalitions to meet in person alongside some state and local partners. The meeting summary can be found <u>here</u>. A team from the Alliance along with other state partners worked on a strategy map focusing on Authentic Family Leadership in System Design and Change as part of the Aces and Resiliency Resource Commons for Communities (ARRCC). ARPA Discretionary Funds, Granite Steps for Quality, Waterford Upstart

The DHHS Bureau of Child Development and Head Start Collaboration recently shared details for <u>their plan</u> ARPA Discretionary Funds. The Bureau is also rolling out a new Quality, Recognition, and Improvement System (QRIS) called "The Granite Steps for Quality".
